	Recognizing the need to coo are used with maximum efficiency,	Recognizing the need to coordinate humanitarian aid so that resources provided used with maximum efficiency,	
	Concerned that the current cluster approach limits the scope of aid currently provided by Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs),		
Appreciates the effective relief mechanisms of the United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UHCR) and further encourages the efforts of this commission,			
Desiring to improve the cluster approach to be more responsive to the needs and culture of disaster affected regions,			
	Mindful of the need to improve accountability in disaster aid to help countries reduce long-term aid dependence and prevent the possibility of aid corruption,		
	<i>Noting</i> the need to raise the standards for humanitarian coordinators involved in implementing the cluster approach,		
	Acknowledging the challenges posed by language barriers relating to both national nd local languages in affected regions,		
	Cognizant of the existence of human rights of all individuals as per the universal declaration of human rights,		
	1. Recommends the establishment of Regional Coordination Councils (RCCs) under the directorate of the United Nations Office for Coordination of Humanitarian Aid (OCHA), to address the local aspects of providing relief services: (a) The RCCs shall consist of the participation of governments and NGOs that ar active in that region; (b) In responding to a specific emergency, RCCs shall work with NGOs active in		
	the immediate area of the emergency in order to provide local knowledge and public		

(c) The RCCs will develop a list of endorsed NGOs for each region;

- (d) A Regional Coordinator will be established to be the director of each regional RCC, reporting to the main committee of the OCHA;
- (e) Approves the creation of reporting links between global and national clusters to ensure that national clusters support sub-national ones;

2. *Suggests* the expansion of the existing clusters to account for NGOs that provide infrastructural and comprehensive aid;

3. *Identifies* the need to create clusters within each region based upon specific vulnerable groups within each region;

- 4. *Suggests* the establishment of regional conferences where NGOs involved in providing aid to each region are able to discuss issues regarding the provision of aid in the region:
- (a) These conferences shall be held biannually in a location agreed to on a caseby-case basis by Member States of each region;
- (b) At these meetings NGOs can make recommendations regarding how their funding is directed;
- (c) These meetings will also allow NGOs to provide suggestions to the full OCHA organization to aid coordination in other regions;
- (d) These meetings will provide a check system where the RCCs can ensure that the NGOs are allocating funding to areas in need;
- (e) These meetings shall provide a mechanism by which NGOs can present their common goals in each region;
- (f) These biannual conferences would discuss healthcare needs based on the necessities and capabilities of each region. In particular they would address ways to manage major disease outbreaks;
- (g) In these biannual conferences each RCC can determine the definition of what constitutes vulnerable parties within each region;

- 5. *Urges* able Member States and NGOs to continue providing funding through the reformed OCHA and RCC system:
- (a) Emphasizes that the central OCHA will continue to exist and provide a global system to ensure transparency and efficient allocation of funds;

- 6. *Proposes* a new training system for local aid coordinators in order to increase competency and reduce turnover in those positions of humanitarian coordinators:
- (a) This training system shall include education in regional and local languages in the region they are being employed;
- (b) Calls for more consistent and long-term leadership within the coordination of different cluster groups in order to ensure accountability;
- (c) Suggests reducing turnover within leadership of the RCC by requiring leadership to remain constant for the duration of the humanitarian crisis;
- (d) Encourages the sustained development of relationships between United Nations and regional humanitarian coordinators;
