Strengthening of the coordination of emergency humanitarian assistance of the United Nations

1 2 3	Understanding the humanitarian threat that is posed by natural disasters and infectious diseases,
4 5 6	Aware of the close link between emergencies such as disease outbreaks and natural disasters,
7 8 9	Noting with deep concern the severe economic costs of natural disasters and outbreaks,
10 11 12	Acknowledging the responsibility of governments in affected nations to quickly report outbreaks of pandemic diseases,
13 14 15	Concerned by the reluctance of governments of affected countries to report outbreaks of pandemic diseases,
16 17 18	$Cognizant \ of \ the \ lack \ of \ trust \ in \ governments \ among \ the \ citizens \ of \ many \ member \ States,$
19 20 21	Recognizing the need to respect all human rights when responding to outbreaks of infectious diseases,
22 23 24	<i>Recalling</i> the limited resources of the World Health Organization (WHO) directly preceding the recent Ebola outbreak,
25 26 27	Bearing in mind the efforts of the WHO in dealing with recent devastating outbreaks,
28 29 30	Convinced of the WHO's potential to most effectively combat outbreaks of infectious diseases, amongst all international organizations,
31 32 33	Reiterating the need to understand potential health risks and pursue preventative measures in order to minimize said risks,

Endorsing the significant contributions towards outbreak relief that organizations and individuals have already provided,

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Reaffirms the Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA)'s coordinating role in responding to global humanitarian crises through collaboration with the WHO and other associated organizations,

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1. Suggests the collection of data in collaboration with governments, related Non-Governmental Organizations (NGO) and the WHO in order to examine and prevent potential disease outbreaks to enable:

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(a) Efficient resource management;

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(b) Effective identification of health threats through comprehensive and regular updates to the WHO database;

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2. *Invites* governments to rapidly and accurately report the onset of outbreaks;

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3. *Emphasizes* the need for trained primary care physicians in areas prone to outbreaks of disease bolstered by:

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(a) The creation of training programs and seminars with affected nations that allows for doctors that are well-versed in the subject of disease outbreaks and pandemics;

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(b) Encouraging nations with the capacity to train health professionals to share this intellectual infrastructure with disease prone areas lacking sufficient healthcare infrastructure;

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4. Encourages the WHO and partner NGOs to work within high-risk areas to train local populaces in effective primary care responses including:

(a) Diagnosis of prominent diseases in the target area;

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(b) Basic preventative medical care;

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(c) Prevention of further spreading of disease through containment measures in accordance with recommendations from the WHO, taking into account the need to respect human rights; (d) Cooperation with international organizations and state governments to

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5. Expresses the need for safety precautions for protecting medical workers in order to properly administer treatment in affected areas while ensuring the safety of aid workers in the areas of infection and violence through:

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(a) The rapid deployment of sanitation kits;

facilitate accelerated response of the aforementioned bodies;

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(b) Cooperation with state governments to help ensure state governments pursue balanced programs that respect the rights and customs of local populations;

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(c) Communication with local governments to help infected populations accept and adapt the assistance programs on a national and international level;

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6. Advises governments to take steps towards preventing the spread of outbreaks through:

79	(a) Health screening programs in major transportation centers;
80	(b) The responsible implementation of quarantine procedures;
81	(c) The improvement of infrastructure to increase emergency relief aid;
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83	7. Noting the need for international responses to balance economic along with
84	humanitarian concerns;
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86	8. Welcomes the WHO to prioritize creating and expanding emergency aid
87	budgets to allow for optimal responses to health crises of varied magnitudes.
