SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Criminal accountability of United Nations officials and experts on mission SUBMITTED TO: The General Assembly Sixth Committee The General Assembly Sixth Committee, Bearing in mind that the charges made against United Nations peacekeepers are a pressing issue that interferes with the United Nations main function as an organization for world peace, Recognizing the need for greater transparency by the United Nations in the charges made against United Nations peacekeepers, Seeking appropriate information to be available to the international community to hold nations to a higher level of accountability, Respecting all nations who participate in United Nations Peacekeeping missions to help resolve conflict, Considering the need to foster an atmosphere of openness in United Nations agencies involved in peacekeeping operations, 1. Encourages the United Nations to regularly publish information concerning specific charges made against United Nations peacekeepers, including the country in which the event occurred and the country from which the peacekeeper(s) are from; 2. Requests that detailed statistics per-country are made available by the United Nations at no expense to host nations on follow-up actions taken, including but not limited to: (a) Detailed information on results of investigations including but not limited to violations of the The Standards of Conduct for the International Civil Service; (b) Charges filed: (c) Disciplinary procedures and prosecutions: 3. *Urges* the United Nations Office of Internal Oversight Services to establish a task force of independent Detective Inspectors General operating under an Inspector

General for Criminal Accountability of United Nations Experts and officials on mission

(a) Auditing and monitoring United Nations missions for misconduct including
