- 1. *Welcomes* commemorative activities for the 20th anniversary of the Fourth World Conference on Women, the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action;

- 2. Calls upon UN Women to:
- (a) Strengthen ties with national authorities;(b) Intensify fundraising efforts and broaden fund raising channels;

(c) Continue coordinating projects with national authorities, nongovernmental organizations, and other institutions to promote gender equality and an end to violence against women:

(d) Respect national conditions, laws, and cultural traditions and avoid the creation of a universal policy rooted in bias;

(e) Assist efforts of nongovernmental organizations in the eradication of sexually transmitted diseases affecting the livelihood of women and men throughout the world;

3. *Requests* that violence against women be addressed in the post-2015 developmental agenda through:

(a) Continuing current Millennium Development Goals;

 (b) Ensuring the inclusion of current and arising developments of the empowerment of women;

4. Urges Member States to condemn all acts of violence against women;

 5. *Urges* the implementation of legislation aligning with the doctrines and policies of the United Nations Charter, the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women, and the Declaration on the Elimination of Violence against Women emphasizing the prevention of violence;

6. *Recommends* all Member States recognize the responsibilities of the media in promoting equality and eliminating media representations of violence against women;

7. *Supports* research on violence against women worldwide, including data collection and statistic compilation and also the dissemination of these findings;

 8. *Reminds* all States of their responsibility to comply with all the doctrines of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and the Charter of the United Nations on this matter.
