	The Historical Security Council – 1961,
1 2	Deeply Concerned about the growing humanitarian issues in the Congo,
3	Recognizing the diversity of parties disputing within the Congo,
5 6 7	Affirming that the United Nations Security Council must remain neutral in allocation,
8 9	Deeply conscious of the trauma affecting the post-conflict areas,
10 11	Fully aware of the particularly vulnerable ethnic populations both within the Congo and around the world,
12 13 14 15	Having considered the safety of United Nations peace keeping and humanitarian workers,
16 17	1. <i>Calls upon</i> the distribution of humanitarian aid in the Congo, particularly pertaining to the massive human need for:
18 19	(a) Medical assistance; (b) Food and nutritional support;
20 21	(c) Temporary housing aid;
22 23 24	<ul><li>2. <i>Urges</i> a binary distributive model that provides:</li><li>(a) An urban distribution effort based on an initial baseline study that would be temporarily constructed in:</li></ul>
25 26	(i) Leopoldville; (ii) Stanleyville;
27 28	(iii) Elizabethville; (iv) Kasai Provence;
29 30	(b) A rural mobile effort that will intend to target vulnerable populations;
31 32 33	3. <i>Solemnly affirms</i> the United Nations Security Council's intention to protect humanitarian aid providers. This will be done through a peace keeping force with a Chapter V mandate with the strict goal of protecting providers.
