SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Oceans and law of the sea

SUBMITTED TO: The General Assembly Plenary (Concurrent)

The General Assembly Plenary (Concurrent),

- 1 Noting that existing Antarctic land claims are valid and legal under the Antarctic Treaty of 1961,
- 2 Concerned by the minimal global recognition of these legal claims,
- 3 Desiring to prevent future conflict in territorial waters,
- 4 Wishing to expand conservation efforts in the waters surrounding Antarctica,
- 1. Urges the universal recognition of the already existing land claims made by Australia, the United Kingdon,
 New Zealand, Chile, France, Argentina and Norway including the surrounding maritime territory under United
 Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea;
- 8 2. Calls upon the nations with Antarctic territory claims to continue to engage in marine conservation 9 efforts;
- 3. Requests that Antarctica continue to be a home to scientific research benefiting the international community as a whole;
- 4. *Upholds* the entirety of the Antarctic Treaty of 1961, in particular the demand that Antarctica be free of military presence.
