SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Outcome document of the Special Event to follow-up efforts made towards achieving the Millennium Development Goals

SUBMITTED TO: The General Assembly Plenary (Concurrent)

The General Assembly Plenary (Concurrent),

- 1 *Keeping in mind* the need to continue the completion of the Millennium Development Goals,
2 *Deeply concerned* with the lack of progress made in some states under the current structure of the Millennium
3 Development Goals,
4 *Affirming* the benefits of sharing information between states freely and without barrier,
5 *Acknowledging* that Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs), private sector businesses, and developed
6 states have contributed and continue to contribute to the eradication of poverty and improvement of nations world-
7 wide,
8 *Alarmed* by the substantial work still needed to complete the Millennium Development Goals,
9 1. *Calls for* a new structure of the Millennium Development Goals that will emphasize the most critical
10 needs of states or regions to:
11 (a) Develop a subcommittee of the United Nations Development Programme to assess the successes
12 and shortcomings of particular regions and states in reaching the Millennium Development Goals;
13 2. *Recommends* the creation of an information sharing conference and database to show the deficits and
14 progress of each individual state by:
15 (a) Creation of a mentorship program that allows for states that have yet to complete specific
16 Millennium Development Goals to partner with states who have had success in reaching those goals to share ideas
17 and programs to promote the achievement of the goals worldwide;
18 (i) Knowing that this mentorship program will not in debt the receiving states to the giving state
19 in anyway;
20 (ii) Urging that this mentorship program be done out of goodwill and for the mutual benefit to all
21 states that benefit from a stable and more advanced world;
22 (b) Recommends the creation of a biannual summit between all states still seeking to achieve specific
23 goals in order to facilitate discussion on how to reach the Millennium Development Goals;
24 (c) Recommends the creation of a database to store data, ideas, and programs, similar to the Food
25 and Agriculture Organization's database of worldwide agriculture programs and under their purview;
26 (i) Allow for access to the database through the World Wide Web for use by all states and their
27 citizens in distributing successful programs and ideas;
28 (ii) Devote a portion of the database specifically to medical information, schematics, and blueprints;
29 (iii) Accepts this information from states on a voluntary basis;
30 3. *Invites* states to further promote university programs to allow for the exchange of students from differing
31 states to specifically further the areas of education, medicine and engineering.
