SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Measures to eliminate international terrorism

SUBMITTED TO: The General Assembly Sixth Committee

The General Assembly Sixth Committee,

1 *Acknowledging* the importance of State sovereignty as stated in Article II of the United Nations Charter,

2 *Recalling* the recent terrorist attacks in France, Mali, Yemen, Lebanon, China, Nigeria and others,

3 *Alarmed by* the increasing number of tragedies as a direct result of international terrorism,

4 *Recognizing* the need for interstate collaborative efforts,

5 *Noting* the unique aspects of terrorism each Member State is facing,

6 *Acknowledging* the lack of concrete plans developed by Member States,

7 *Reaffirming* the fifth operative clause in resolution 6/70 of the Sixth Committee,

8 1. *Calls for* the creation of a summit of Member States within twelve months of the adoption of this
9 resolution;

10 2. *Urges* Member States to convene bi-annually at a comprehensive summit to discuss solutions to legal
11 implementation problems faced by Member States;

12 3. *Suggests* that regional summits be held with greater frequency, with meeting times determined by Member
13 States in the region, to ensure that information is up to date and that all States have the necessary information to
14 act diligently and responsibly;

15 4. *Encourages* Member States to discuss the implementation of programs to combat terrorism on a State by
16 State basis;

17 5. *Expresses its hope* that these summits will facilitate the implementation of plans that will be adopted
18 into law by the respective Member States;

19 6. *Recommends* that Member States consider the relevant issues concerning terrorism and its prevention,
20 including the following:

21 (a) Prevention of recruitment through the utilization of internet hot spots such as social media, chat
22 rooms and forums;

23 (b) Monitoring the flow of funds to terrorist organizations;

24 (c) Collaboration among Member States in order to create infrastructure to combat cyber-terrorism;

25 (d) Enhancing education in a way that addresses the roots of terrorism;

26 (i) Increasing literacy;

27 (ii) Increasing interfaith and cross-cultural dialogue;

28 7. *Further Recommends* that these Member States look to the United Nations as a partner in the creation
29 of anti-terrorism laws.
