SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Measures to eliminate international terrorism

SUBMITTED TO: The General Assembly Sixth Committee

The General Assembly Sixth Committee,

1 *Bearing in mind* that terrorism is not connected to any one race, religion or specific civilization,

2 *Recognizing* the need for an official response to terrorist activities,

3 *Aware* that military action alone is not sufficient to combat this global issue,

4 *Noting* that marginalized groups are more vulnerable to radicalization and extremism that tend to lead to
5 terrorist activities,

6 *Guided by* the United Nations Charter to protect the lives of innocent civilians against crimes against
7 humanity,

8 *Recognizing* the role of regional organizations, structures, and strategies in combating terrorism by consid-
9 ering the use of best practices developed by their regions,

10 *Expressing concern* of the increased use of information and communication technology by terrorists and their
11 supporters to plan terrorist acts in a globalizing society,

12 *Understanding* the need for cooperation among Member States in the fight against terrorism while respecting
13 human rights,

14 1. *Calls* for cooperation among States to eliminate terrorism in all its forms;

15 2. *Recalls* the United Nations Global Counter Terrorism Strategy Measures to deter terrorism;

16 3. *Highly recommends* all the States to use awareness programs to fight the underlying factors that are
17 conducive to terrorism;

18 4. *Calls upon* Member States to recognize how United Nations bodies including United Nations Children's
19 Fund, United Nations High Commission for Refugees and United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Orga-
20 nization can be helpful in combatting the radicalization and extremism that leads to terrorism;

21 5. *Encourages* States to implement guidelines and standards under the United Nations framework according
22 to their regional and cultural needs;

23 6. *Urges* States and international organizations to implement the following measures:

24 (a) An increase in access to education and medical treatment;

25 (b) Works to improve quality and quantity of infrastructure with and between States;

26 (c) Effective cooperation between international organizations and States with respect to national
27 sovereignty and cultural differences;

28 (d) Encourages States to consider implementing rehabilitation and recovery programs in prisons to
29 prevent the recruitment and radicalization of people to terrorist organizations;

30 7. *Strongly affirms* the need to uphold all legal international instruments that protect human rights;

31 8. *Supports* a fair and just international legal framework for combating international terrorism.
