SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: The law of transboundary aquifers

SUBMITTED TO: The General Assembly Sixth Committee

The General Assembly Sixth Committee,

- Recognizing that access to clean and safe water is a human right,
- Noting specifically the success of the PLUSK Geographic Information System (GIS) between Poland and Slovakia,
- Also noting that the provisions of the Draft Articles on the Law of Transboundary Aquifers, annexed in resolution 63/124, have been taken into account in relevant instruments such as the Guarani Aquifer Agreement signed by Argentina, Brazil, Paraguay and Uruguay in 2010,
- Noting further the 2011 treaty between Romania and Hungary concerning the Mures Alluvial Fan Aquifer
  System,
- 9 Recognizing the injustice of monopolistic exploitation of water rights,
- 10 Recalling specifically Article 4 of the Draft Articles,
- 1. Recommends that states use the Draft Articles for guidance in the creation of bilateral and regional agreements for the use of aquifers;
  - 2. Encourages further creation of geographic information systems similar to PLUSK;
- 3. Encourages the International Hydrological Programme of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization to continue its contribution by offering further scientific and technical assistance to the States concerned;
- 4. *Urges* States who have access to aquifers to not use their possession of this water to establish a monopolistic system of extracting monetary gain from states not fortunate enough to have access to their own clean water sources;
- 5. Further urges States to comply with Article 4 of the Draft Articles to ensure equitable and reasonable use of transboundary aquifers.
