SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: The Question of Palestine

SUBMITTED TO: The Historical Security Council – 1967

The Historical Security Council - 1967,

- Alarmed by the escalation of tensions between the Syrian Arab Republic, Israel, and Egypt as brought to the attention of the Security Council by the Office of the Secretary-General,
- 3 Noting the comments of the Representatives from Egypt, Jordan, Israel, and the Syrian Arab Republic,
- Reaffirming all previous United Nations Security Council action in regard to the situation in Palestine, such as Resolution 228 (1966) and the General Armistice Agreements (1949),
 - Expressing its absolute neutrality in regard to the situation in Palestine,
 - Recalling Jordan's stated agreement to avoid further escalation of the situation and to recognize Israel as a sovereign state once an official treaty with the nearby states of Israel, Egypt, and Syrian Arab Republic is signed resolving territorial disputes,
- 1. Requests an immediate cessation of hostilities between all state and non-state actors within Israel, Egypt, and the Syrian Arab Republic;
 - 2. Calls upon Israel to remove all civilians and non-civilians from the Golan Heights demilitarized zone;
 - 3. Calls upon Egypt to remove all civilians and non-civilians from the Sinai Peninsula demilitarized zone. Passed by consensus, with 0 abstentions
