Statement by the President of the Security Council

At the meeting of the Security Council, held on 13 March 2003, in connection with the Council's consideration of the item entitled The Situation in the Democratic Republic of Congo, the President of the Security Council made 2 the following statement on behalf of the Council: 3

The Security Council is gravely concerned about the brutalization of civilians during the conflict in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. The Council believes one of the most egregious offenses has been the employment of rape as a mechanism of war. Not only does the Council believe this is an act of violence against women, children, and all impacted civilians; it is also a clear and direct violation of international law. This Council feels this needs to be addressed and that such actions will not be tolerated. The Council would encourage that those reponsible be tried and that parties to conflict not involve civilians in ongoing unrest.

The Security Council will continue to pay close attention to developments.

Passed by consensus, with 0 abstentions
