SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: The Situation in Sudan and South Sudan

SUBMITTED TO: The Security Council

The Security Council,

1 *Recalling* all previous resolutions and presidential statements concerning the situation in Sudan and South
2 Sudan, specifically concerning resolution 2205 (2015), 2230 (2015) and its substantive resolutions,

3 *Fulfilling* the commitments of the United Nations Declaration of Human Rights,

4 *Reaffirming* strong commitment to sovereignty, independence, and territorial integrity of Sudan and South
5 Sudan,

6 *Reiterating* the importance of non-interference and regional cooperation with culturally connected regions
7 such as Sudan and South Sudan,

8 *Stressing* the importance of the complete implementation of the Comprehensive Peace Agreement (CPA), the
9 Joint Political and Security Mechanism (JPSM) and the Joint Border verification and Monitoring Mission (JBVMM)
10 on the border of Sudan and South Sudan following demarcation of the border,

11 *Condemning* the use of force and reaffirming the demilitarization of Abyei,

12 *Concerned* for the safety of civilians in and around the region of Abyei,

13 *Alarmed* by the reports of the potential involvement of the Sudan People's Liberation Army (SPLA) in the
14 Abyei region,

15 *Reaffirms* the need for a successful mandate ensuring security and safety of citizens in Abyei,

16 *Recognizing* the importance of dialogue for sustainable peace between the tribes of the region, including the
17 Misseryia and Ngok Dinka,

18 *Acknowledging* that the current situation in Abyei and along the border between the Sudan and South Sudan
19 border is detrimental to the region,

20 1. *Affirms* the extension until 15 March 2016 the mandate of the United Nations Interim Security Force for
21 Abyei (UNISFA) as set out in paragraph 2 of resolution 1990 (2011) and improved by resolution 2024 (2011) and
22 paragraph 1 of resolution 2075 (2012), and decides for the purposes of paragraph 1 of resolution 2024 (2011), further
23 support to the operational activities of the JBVMM and Ad Hoc Committees, as appropriate when so requested by
24 consensual decisions of these mechanisms, within UNISFA's operational area and existing capabilities;

25 2. *Condemns* the recent attack in the Abyei region;

26 3. *Promotes* the continued cooperation between the government of Sudan and South Sudan for peace,
27 security and stability;

28 4. *Further condemns* the use of force and reaffirming the demilitarization of Abyei as stipulated in the 20
29 June 2011 Agreement on Temporary Arrangements for the Administration and Security of the Abyei Area and that
30 only UNISFA is authorized to carry weapons inside;

31 5. *Coordinates* with all the aforementioned organizations as well as the African Union to bring complementary
32 and sustainable efforts to ensure security and stability of the region;

33 6. *Reaffirms* the importance of the Abyei Area Joint Investigation and Inquiry Committee (AAJIIC) to
34 investigate the ethnic, nationalist, and tribal groups in the region to assist in facilitating greater dialogue and the
35 implementation of peace agreements;

36 7. *Further requests* the AAJIIC to investigate the recent attack in the region of Abyei;

- 37 8. *Reminds* that the protection of civilians as set out in the mandate of UNISFA in paragraph 3 of resolution
38 1990 (2011) is pertinent to the integrity of the mission;
- 39 9. *Encourages* strengthening the facilitation of talks between involved parties, including Sudan and South
40 Sudan, as well as Ethiopia as a mediator, to help implement the CPA and demarcating the border between the
41 countries;
- 42 10. *Calls upon* States to assist in ensuring the full implementation of the mandate;
- 43 11. *Requests* the Secretary-General to continue to inform the Council of progress in implementing UNISFA's
44 mandate and to continue to bring the Council's immediate attention to violations of relevant agreements;
- 45 12. *Decides* to remain actively seized of the matter.

Passed by consensus, with 0 abstentions
