SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: National legislation on transfer of arms, military equipment and

dual-use goods and technology

SUBMITTED TO: The General Assembly First Committee

The General Assembly First Committee,

Noting the work already done in regards to non-proliferation throughresolution 61/89 of 6 December 2006, resolution 64/48 of 2 December 2009, and the subsequent Arms Trade Treaty (ATT) approved on 2 April 2013,

Applauding the actions MemberStates have taken to ratify the ATT as well as those that have signed the ATT and are presently in the process of ratifying the ATT,

Recalling the effective nature of allowing individual Member States to help police themselves on the issue of 5 arms proliferation according to an international standard, 6

Acknowledging that work still needs to be done to ensure that the international arms trade standards 7 suggested by the ATT become realized, 8

Stressing the importance of universalization of arms control standards for future peace and stability,

Convinced that providing Member States with an opportunity to demonstrate their good faith towards the 10 ATT would advance the establishment of international standards for arms trade, 11

Reaffirming the rights of self-defense for all Member States, whether individually or collectively, as noted in Article 51 of the Charter of the United Nations,

- 1. Requests the Secretary General to establish a review commission within the Office for Disarmament Affairs of the Secretariat (UNODA) in which all arms trade deals might be reviewed on a voluntary basis to assess compliance with international standards;
- 2. Requests further that the Secretary General provide the new review commission with the necessary 17 resources and tools needed to perform a review of transnational arms trade; 18
- 3. Invites Member States to take additional steps to develop an international culture accepting of the 19 international standards; 20
- 4. Encourages Member States to adopt national legislation for the utilization of the UNODA's reviewas a 21 means a showing good faith in keeping with international non-proliferation standards; 22
- 5. Calls on the Secretary General to make available information only on Member States which both utilize 23 the review as well as demonstrate adherence to international standards in an annual report;
  - 6. Resolves to remain seized on matters of non-proliferation.
