## American Model United Nations General Assembly First Committee

SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Prevention of an arms race in outer space

SUBMITTED TO: The General Assembly First Committee

The General Assembly First Committee,

- Reaffirming General Assembly resolution 70/26 of 7 December 2015,
- 2 Affirming the use of outer space for all of mankind with peaceful intent,
  - Observing that the prevention of an arms race in outer space would inhibit an international catastrophe,
  - Keeping in mind past General Assembly resolutions 45/55 4 December 1990, 47/51 9 December 1992 and 48/74 16 December 1993,

Recalling the draft treaty on the Prevention of the Placement of Weapons in Outer Space and of the Threat or Use of Force against Outer Space Objects (PPWT) in 2008 by China and the Russian Federation at the Conference on Disarmament and the updated version in 2014,

- 1. Strongly recommends the adoption of the Draft Treaty on the Prevention of the Placement of Weapons 9 10 in Outer Space, the Threat or Use of Force against Outer Space Objects from the 2014 Conference on Disarmament which defines:
- (a) The term "outer space object" is defined as any device placed in outer space and designed for 12 operating therein; 13
- 14 (b) The term "weapon in outer space" is defined as any outer space object or component thereof which has been produced or converted to destroy, damage or disrupt the normal functioning of objects in outer 15 space, on the Earth's surface or in its atmosphere, or to eliminate human beings or components of the biosphere 16 which are important to human existence, or to inflict damage on them by using any principles of physics; 17
  - (c) A device is "placed in outer space" if it orbits the Earth at least once, or follows a section of such an orbit before leaving that orbit, or is permanently located in outer space or on any celestial bodies other than the Earth:
  - (d) The term "use of force" to mean any action intended to inflict damage on an outer space object under the jurisdiction and or control of other Member States, and the term "threat of force" means the clear expression in written, oral or any other form of communication of the intention to commit such an action. Actions undertaken in accordance with special agreements with Member States that provide for actions on the request of such Member States to stop uncontrolled flight by outer space objects under the jurisdiction andor control of the requesting Member States shall not be regarded as the use or threat of force;
    - 2. Urges Member States to enforce existing resolutions and agreements to the best of their abilities;
    - 3. Calls upon those with impactive space capabilities to:
  - (a) Contribute actively to the objective of peaceful uses of outer space and the prevention of an arms race in outer space;
- (b) Refrain from contrary actions and relevant existing treaties in the goal of maintaining global 31 peace and cooperation; 32
- (c) Inform the Conference on Disarmament on the progress of bilateral and multilateral activities in 33 34 outer space;
  - 4. Supports the essential future applicable and efficient measures to prevent an arms race in outer space;
  - 5. Encourages all Member States to contribute efforts to produce a peaceful and comprehensive agreement;
