## Statement by the President of the Security Council

At the meeting of the Security Council, held on 21November, 2016, in connection with the Council's consideration of the item entitled The Situation in Syria, the President of the Security Council made the following statement on behalf of the Council:

The Secuity Council expresses its deepest sympathy for the victims of chemical weapons attacks and its conviction that all actors involved in these attacks must be investigated and held accountable.

Additionally, the Security Council reiterates the United Nations' commitment to a resolution of the Syrian Crisis and its commitment to human rights.

The Security Council strongly encourages the creation of a partnership between the International Criminal Police Organization (INTERPOL) and the Organization for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW)-United Nations Joint Investigative Mechanism (JIM), given the spike in security threats in Syria, specifically, the recent use of chlorine barrel-bombs. The partnership would increase resources available to the current OPCW-UN JIM as it proceeds with its inspections in the Syrian Arab Republic regarding the weaponization, storage, delivery, and use of toxic chemicals as weapons, and to identify the involvement of non-state actors. The addition of INTERPOL Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear, and Explosive (CBRNE)Terrorism Prevention Program, with its extensive experience having previously worked with the World Health Organization (WHO) and the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC), will be beneficial in aiding the OPCW-UN JIM to draw conclusinve findings on the events that transpired in Syria. These findings must then be reported to the Secretary-General for further action.

The Security Council will continue to pay close attention to developments.
