SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Antimicrobial resistance

SUBMITTED TO: The General Council of the Food and Agriculture Organization

The General Council of the Food and Agriculture Organization,

Taking into consideration the responsibility of the United Nations to provide the most efficient and effective methods to Member States on behalf of their agricultural needs,

Further considering the need for better veterinary practices that accurately aid in diagnoses of livestock,

Alarmed by the percentage of antibiotics inappropriately prescribed to livestock,

Deeply concerned by the reality that overprescription of antibiotics in livestock is aiding in the manifestation of superbugs amongst humans, as well as increasing the susceptibility of humans to resistant bacteria as recognized by the United States Federal Drug Administration,

8 Having examined the lack of veterinary options for livestock in both developing and developed Member 9 States,

- 1. Recommends the FAO seek out an organization similar to the International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD) to establish a grant system to assist in providing individuals the opportunity to pursue veterinary education focusing on livestock in underserved locations;
- 2. Requests the FAO seek out an organization similar to the International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD) to provide a grant system to fund further veterinary education in shelter, proper types of feed, herd management and wellness care to find more effective systems to diagnose animals and treat disease outside of overdiagnosis and overprescription of antibiotics;
- 3. Encourages Member States to utilize antimicrobial stewardship programs (ASPs) and pharmacodynamics (PD) properties of antibiotics to educate veterinarians;
- 4. *Urges* the FAO seek out an organization similar to the International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD) to consider establishing a fund to assist in the construction of veterinary clinics in underserved areas.
