SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: The Situation in Egypt

SUBMITTED TO: The Historical Security Council – 1956

The Historical Security Council - 1956,

Taking note of the heightening tensions in the region and keeping in mind the need for de-escalation,

1. Further calls an international convention for the purpose of setting international standards and agreements by which the Suez Canal will be operated in the future, with the objective of ensuring that all parties interested in 3 the canal, especially Egypt, be given the opportunity to reach a universally agreeable arrangement for the purpose 4 of preventing any future tension regarding the canal:

(a) Attendees to this conference must include representatives of the governments of Egypt, France, the United Kingdom, and the representatives of the Suez Canal Company. Each of these representatives agree to attend the confrence for its decisions to be binding, and each of which would have veto authority over any decision of the conference;

(b) Suggests that the attendees include, but are not limited to representatives of any state that deems the canal to be vital to their national interests.
