SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: The Situation in Haiti

SUBMITTED TO: The Historical Security Council – 1994

The Historical Security Council - 1994,

- 1 Alarmed by the limits of political freedom imposed by the Haitian military coup,
- 2 Recognizing the importance of peace talks in solving the issue,
- 3 Dedicated to preventing further civilian deaths on the Haitian island, as demonstrated by the removal of 4 civilian monitors from the island in October of 1993,
- Keeping in mind the opportunity to reinstate civilian monitors if lines of communication between Special Envoy Caputo and the Haitian military leaders reopen and the area is deemed safe for civilians,
 - 1. United Nations Peacekeeping Force of Brazilian and Canadian Army Logistical Troops to appropriately distribute and transport all relief and humanitarian aid provided by the international community and will distribute according to UNMIH's operational needs and determinations:
 - (a) United Nations Peacekeeping Force of Brazilian and Canadian Army Logistical Troops to appropriately distribute and transport all relief and humanitarian aid provided by the international community and will distribute according to UNMIH's operational needs and determinations;
 - (i) Brazil will provide 200 logistical troops and Canada will provide 100 logistical troops;
- (b) Brazilian and Canadian forces shall be permitted to defend themselves with available and proportional force if and when confronted with hostile threats;
- 16 (c) Requests the commander of the Brazilian forces in Haiti publish a report about observations in 17 the region and actions taken by all involved parties;
- 2. Requests the Secretary General to appoint a mediaton for the formation of peace talks between the Haitian military leaders and the Aristide faction.
