Statement by the President of the Security Council

1 At the meeting of the Security Council, held on 4th of January, 1994, in connection with the Council's
2 consideration of the item entitled "Open Agenda," the President of the Security Council made the following statement
3 on behalf of the Council:

4 The Security Council recognizes and notes with concern the bombings of Sarajevo and the current ethnic
5 violence in Bosnia-Herzegovina. This body has been criticized for its lack of action during the crisis and can assure
6 the international community that the horrors in Bosnia-Herzegovina are of utmost concern, and the Security Council
7 is urgently working to create a course of action, including the enhancement of peace-making operations in the region.
8 Currently, in addition to the violence of Bosnians and Croats, the Bosnia-Herzegovina state is struggling to facilitate
9 the flow of supplies to its suffering citizens. This body is dedicated to providing humanitarian aid and encouraging
10 a peaceful ceasefire among warring groups

11 The Security Council will continue to pay close attention to developments.
