SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Human rights in the Information Society

SUBMITTED TO: The World Summit on the Information Society +10

The World Summit on the Information Society +10,

1 *Reaffirming* resolution S/RES/2195 that terrorism, in all forms is one of the most serious threats to security,
2 global peace, and human rights,

3 *Bolstering* an understanding of the necessity to maintain local cultures and tradition in light of globalization
4 through the internet among the developing states,

5 *Gravely concerned* by the use of the internet as a leading tool in terrorist organization recruitment and
6 attacks,

7 *Alarmed by* limited civilian access to basic human rights due to fear of possible internet based threats,

8 *Emphasizes* the protection of civilians from exposure to apprehensive information and influences,

9 *Guided by* the innate right of state sovereignty and the respect for individual strife of states,

10 *Acknowledging* the apprehension individuals feel towards the accuracy of information within social media
11 and other journalistic sources,

12 1. *Regrets* the allowance by Member States in the spread of terroristic propaganda on publicly accessible
13 web-based platforms;

14 2. *Encourages* Member States to protect the human right of privacy through customizable anti-terrorism
15 programs;

16 3. *Endorses* the development of programs through Non Governmental Organtizations (NGOs) that allow
17 Member States to screen for content promoting terror propaganda and other threats that limit personal and societal
18 security and access to truth and privacy;

19 4. *Emphasizes* its hope for the support of the basic human right to safety and free access to accurate
20 information;

21 5. *Promotes* communication among Member States to share and publish pertinent information regarding
22 these programs;

23 6. *Recomends* the collaboration between regional Member States in holding each other accountable in
24 adhering to these guidelines.
