**Historical Security Council – 1948**

**Statement by the President of the Security Council**

1           At the meeting held on January 10th, 1948 in connection with the escalation of violence in the territory of  
2 Kashmir, the President of the Security Council made the following statement on behalf of the Council:

3           The Security Council mourns the excessive loss of life currently being seen in the region of South Asia. There  
4 is a risk of escalation to the current violence. We call for a mutual draw-back of regular army units from the border  
5 between West Pakistan and India, the precise details to be moderated by the previously employed special committee  
6 to be determined and agreed upon by both parties. The council urges for the maintenance of border security  
7 forces, with the exception of the Indian and Pakistani armies, along the current line of control which requires a  
8 mutual condemnation of sectarian violence of both sides. The council calls for the introduction of observers from the  
9 international community and the concerned parties into both border forces and Indian law enforcement remaining  
10 in Jammu and Kashmir.
