SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: The Situation of Bosnia-Herzegovina

SUBMITTED TO: The Historical Security Council – 1993

The Historical Security Council - 1993,

Reaffirming its resolution 713 (1991) of 25 September 1991 and all subsequent relevant resolutions regarding the Situation of Bosnia-Herzegovina,

3 Having considered the report of the Secretary-General (S/25704 and Add.1) pursuant to paragraph 2 of 4 resolution 808 (1993),

Reaffirming its serious concern of widespread violations of international humanitarian law occurring within the territory of the former Yugoslavia and especially in the Republic of Bosnia-Herzegovina,

Determined to put an end to such crimes, to avoid such crimes in the future, and to take effective measures to bring to justice the persons who are responsible for them,

Convinced that in the particular circumstances of the former Yugoslavia, the establishment of an international tribunal and the prosecution of persons responsible for serious violations of international humanitarian law would enable this aim to be achieved and would contribute to the restoration and maintenance of peace,

Recognizing the establishment of an international tribunal for the prosecution of persons responsible for serious violations of international humanitarian law is not an exhaustive measure to achieve peace and justice in the region,

Believing that the establishment of an international tribunal and the prosecution of persons responsible for the above-mentioned violations of international humanitarian law will contribute to ensuring that such violations are halted and effectively redressed,

Having considered that the Netherlands, having appeared before the United Nations Security Council on 25 May 1993, approves of the establishment of an international tribunal in its territory for the prosecution of persons responsible for serious violations of international humanitarian law,

Reaffirming its decision in resolution 808 (1993) to establish an international tribunal for the prosecution of persons responsible for serious violations of international humanitarian law committed in the territory of the former Yugoslavia since 1991,

Acting under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations,

- 1. Approves the report of the Secretary-General;
- 2. Decides to establish an international tribunal, the International Criminal Tribunal for the former Yugoslavia, to prosecute persons responsible for serious violations of international humanitarian law committed in the territory of the former Yugoslavia between 1 January 1991 and a date in the future upon the restoration of peace, to be determined by the Security Council:
- 30. Requests that the Secretary-General submit to the judges of the International Tribunal any suggestions 31. received from States for the rules of procedure and evidence called for in Article 15 of the Statue of the International 32. Tribunal upon their election;
- 4. Requests that any judges with affiliations to former Yugoslavian territories recuse themselves from the Tribunal:
- 5. Decides that all states shall cooperate fully with the International Tribunal in accordance with the present resolution and the United Nations Charter;

- 6. Reaffirms the obligation of Member States to take any measures necessary under their domestic law to implement the provisions of the present resolution and any rulings made by the International Tribunal;
- 7. Urges the contribution of funds, equipment and services to the International Tribunal by Member States and intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations;
- 8. Recognizes the right of victims to seek, through appropriate means, compensation for harm experienced or other related damages from violations of international humanitarian law committed by individuals brought before the International Tribunal;
 - 9. Requests the Secretary-General to implement urgently the present resolution;
 - 10. Decides to remain actively seized of the matter.
