SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: The Situation in Somalia

SUBMITTED TO: The Historical Security Council – 1993

The Historical Security Council – 1993,

- 1 *Reaffirming* resolution 751 and all other relevant resolutions regarding the situation in Somalia,
2 *Emphasizing* the crisis within Somalia and the loss of life,
3 *Alarmed* by the continuing famine and starvation in Somalia,
4 *Stressing* the need for all the parties in Somalia to exercise maximum restraint and to work towards national
5 reconciliation,
6 *Recognizing* that the people of Somalia bear the ultimate responsibility for national reconciliation and re-
7 construction of their own country,
8 *Condemning* the continuing acts of violence and armed attacks against persons engaged in humanitarian
9 and peacekeeping efforts and paying tribute to lives lost in the effort,
10 *Noting* that the United States forces will be authorized and commanded under United States officials and
11 Moroccan generals, with Djibouti oversight as well as being separate from United Nations peacekeeping forces,
12 *Expressing* its appreciation of an added 10,000 troops from Pakistan, 1,000 from France, 100 from New
13 Zealand, 5,000 from Japan and 10,000 from Brazil, to cooperate with United Nations peacekeeping forces in the
14 distribution of humanitarian aid,
15 *Affirming* the cooperation of United States forces with United Nations forces after violence within Somalia
16 has subsided and warlords within the country have been suppressed,
17 1. *Calls* for member states to increase support in the relief effort:
18 (a) Requests additional military forces to escort aid to affected peoples;
19 (b) Encourages Member States to contribute forces to ease tensions and suppress violence from local
20 warring clans;
21 2. *Directs* UNOSOM II forces to work proactively with United States forces on the ground in Somalia;
22 3. *Urges* Member States to contribute or provide logistical support to the humanitarian aid, including but
23 not limited to medical and food supplies;
24 4. *Encourages* those who are in a position to do so to contribute, on an urgent basis, troops, equipment,
25 financial and logistical support to enhance UNOSOM II's capability to carry out its mandate and to ensure the safety
26 of the personnel;
27 5. *Stressing* the continuing United Nations Operations in Somalia (UNOSOM II) mandate , as well as an
28 additional contribution of 25,000 troops, from the United States and 10,000 from Morocco, to be deployed in Somalia
29 for humanitarian aid and protection against warlords during delivery of said aid.
