SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Promoting the health of migrants

SUBMITTED TO: The World Health Organization Executive Board

The World Health Organization Executive Board,

Reaffirming the mission of the World Health Organization to improve health, particularly among disadvantaged populations,

Acknowledging the cost-effectiveness of addressing migrant health through preventative health services as opposed to emergency care,

Recognizing instances of misdiagnoses and delayed care of migrants due to cultural and linguistic barriers are prevalent,

Recognizing the effectiveness of social benefits transfer programs such as the Zambian Workers Compensation 8 Fund between Zambia and Malawi,

- 9 1. Encouraging delivery of migrant-inclusive services in a culturally and linguistically appropriate way through:
 - (a) Systems of tele-translation accessible to health providers in rural and urban areas;
 - (b) Translated written materials and cultural mediation in hospitals and health centers;
 - (c) Adoption of best practices including but not limited to;
 - (i) Training of health professionals in cultural competencies and multiculturalism;
 - (ii) Cultural competence training for mental health staff to improve the knowledge, attitudes, and skills of mental health professionals;
 - (d) Provide a migrant training program that;
 - (i) Trains migrants in medical practices and health education focusing on personal hygiene, maternal and child health, and sanitation.
