SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Global vaccine action plan

SUBMITTED TO: The World Health Organization Executive Board

The World Health Organization Executive Board,

- Recognizing the need for a multifaceted and holistic approach to increasing the efficacy, reach, and impact of vaccines in a way that helps the maximum number of people,
- Reminding the body that a complex, long-term solution would take time to execute, and meanwhile, there are still people affected by preventable infection,
- 5 Recognizing the need for a short-term solution to the problem of underserved and under-vaccinated areas,
- 6 Notes the burden of supporting and staffing sterile clinics in remote locations,
- 7 Takes note of the past initiatives of the World Health Organization (WHO) and Member States such as 8 Georgia and Bhutan,
- 9 1. Proposes the implementation of a mobile vaccine unit, in the model of a mobile-clinic, that travels to 10 regions with low vaccination rates to administer vaccines in a sterile, professional and lower-cost manner;
- 2. Welcomes the integration of data-sharing and data-analysis initiatives in the targeting of where the mobile vaccine unit program will be targeted;
- 3. Recommends the integration of education programs and initiatives with the mobile vaccine unit as it travels as well as partnerships with local universities and medical personnel to ensure communication and understanding in served communities;
- 4. Further invites collaboration among governmental entities, non governmental entities such as the United Nations International Children's Fund (UNICEF), the International Organization for Migration (IOM), the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) and private organizations and Members States supporting the vision and mission of the mobile vaccine unit to provide a more immediate and short term solution to the problem of under-vaccinated areas;
 - 5. Encourages the unified support and collaboration of United Nations (UN) Member States.
