SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Taking action against gender-related killing of women and girls

SUBMITTED TO: The Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice

The Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice,

Recalling the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and principles of the Charter of the United Nations,

Welcoming the efforts made by the Fund for Gender Equality (FGE) in supporting national, women-led, civil society organizations and helping to achieve womens empowerment,

Stressing the empowerment and support of women as a method to eliminate all forms of violence against women,

Recognizes that a substantial portion of femicides stems from societal and sociocultural parameters,

Alarmed by the statistic provided by the European Journal of Development Research that 74% of women with less than 5 years of education have experienced physical violence in comparison the 13% of those with higher education,

Remembering the precedents set in 1979 by the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination
Against Women that established women's rights as human rights,

- 1. Acknowledges all efforts should be done in a manner that respects state sovereignty and seeks to improve the quality of life for all;
  - 2. Defines femicide as intentional, gender-based killings of women and girls;
- 3. *Defines* violence against women as: physical, sexual, and psychological violence, including but not limited to: stalking, female genital mutilation, forced abortion, forced sterilization and sexual harassment;
- 4. Recommends the review of gender-based laws and their relation to women by the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women (UN Women) Evaluation Committee;
- 5. *Encourages* the gradual and continuous advancement in alignment with the efforts of UN Women and the Spotlight Initiative;
- 6. *Urges* Member States to undertake steps to initiate the education of individuals without bias towards gender:
  - (a) Educate teachers, government officials, and local leaders on the signs of violence in households;
  - (b) Ensure that all children receive a primary school education;
  - (c) Implement gender-sensitive education practice;
- 26 (d) Meet literacy rates with the help of The United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the 27 Empowerment of Women.
