SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Nuclear disarmament

The General Assembly First Committee,

- 1 Emphasizing the current nuclear tensions in the Middle East, and the importance of peace in the Middle East, 2 East,
- 3 Alarmed by the lack of effort to create a safer Middle East,
- 4 Understanding the monumental oversight that this resolution requires,
- Recalling the commitments to denuclearization made in the Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons (NPT), the Comprehensive Nuclear Test Ban Treaty (CTBT) and the Universal Declaration on the Achievement of a Nuclear-Free-World,
- 8 Emphasizing the importance of the safety of humans and animals in the disposal of nuclear waste,
- 9 Deeply Concerned by the potential wide-spread nuclearization of the Middle East,
- 10 Hopeful for further nuclear non-proliferation world-wide and other nuclear free zones,
- 1. Solemnly affirms the need to create a Nuclear Weapon Free Zone in the Middle East, encompassing 3,500,000 square miles (9,000,000 square kilometers):
- 13 (a) Requests the United Nations Security Council look into economic sanctions against Middle 14 Eastern states who violate a nuclear free zone;
- (b) Suggests that states that have economic sanctions in place due to nuclear tension should remove them if the state is in compliance with this resolution;
- 17 (c) Member States that are considered in the Middle East are North Africa, Egypt, Bahrain, Cyprus, 18 Iran, Iraq, Israel, Jordan, Kuwait, Lebanon, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Syria, the United Arab Emirates and 19 Yemen:
- 20 2. Requests that the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) conduct research on nuclear energy without condemnation in the Middle East:
- (a) Nuclear energy research will be defined as research into the use of nuclear elements to limit energy instability caused by continued tension in the Middle East in order to transition away from nuclear weapons;
 - (b) Audits will be to the standards set by the IAEA;

- 3. Further Encourages a willing communication between all Member States involved in this resolution in order to utilize nuclear energy to begin the movement away from nuclear weapons in the Middle East;
- 4. Suggests, if a Member State is willing, research in order to find safer and more efficient radioactive compounds to use for nuclear energy;
- 5. *Invites* Member States of this resolution to do further research on safer ways to dispose of any nuclear product in order to better facilitate safe disarmament:
- 31 (a) Safe ways will include locations that mitigate harm to the environment, and or the inhabitants 32 of the environment:
- 33 (b) Research shall be focused on methods of nuclear waste removal such as artificial nuclear trans-34 mutation, long term above ground storage, direct injection, and other new methods;
 - 6. Trusts that Member States will find safe environments to dispose their waste:

- 36 (a) States are strongly encouraged to dispose of waste in the least harmful method available in order 37 to slowly and safely transition away from nuclear weapons;
 - (b) Member States are encouraged to share effective methods of nuclear waste removal.
