SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: International migration and development

SUBMITTED TO: The General Assembly Second Committee

The General Assembly Second Committee,

- 1 *Acknowledging* the high influx of international migrants and its 21 percent rise within the past twenty years,
2 *Aware of* the global bias against migrants and how that prejudice creates a tendency for them to be dis-
3 criminated against in the workplace,
4 *Cognizant of* the oppression that women migrants are often faced with,
5 *Drawing attention* to cultural and language barriers that can slow or prevent migrants from fully integrating
6 into their country of residency,
7 *Reaffirming* the Charter of the United Nations, particularly Article 2 that states the TLMP is based on the
8 principle of the sovereign equality of all its Members,
9 *Bearing in mind* the differing capacities within Member States to support migrants economically, physically
10 and socially,
11 *Recognizing* the importance of the return and reintegration of migrant populations who wish to make their
12 way back to their home countries in an efficient, economically safe, and mutually beneficial manner,
13 *Emphasizing* the positive impact of migrants on the global economy,
14 1. *Suggests* the creation of an international system of current and previous crises with the purpose of enabling
15 nation-states to predict the human and economic impact of future crises which in turn could guide future migration
16 policy by:
17 (a) Including an in-depth profile of the largest causes of migration to be created and consulted when
18 any new migration plans are to be passed; and;
19 (b) Consisting of the most accurate details about current and previous crises across the globe in an
20 effort to gauge where, when, and how migrants will depart countries;
21 2. *Recommends* that this committee support a comprehensive Migrant Workforce Relocation Program
22 (MWRP), a subcommittee of the Global Compact for Safe, Orderly and Regular Migration (GCM):
23 (a) Inviting the pairing of migrants to new host countries that can provide labor and skills to
24 contribute to the global economy;
25 (b) Efficient logistics to ensure that host countries have the opportunity to support those migrants;
26 and;
27 3. *Suggests* the MWRP respond to migrant workers in need of relocation to receiving countries, by bearing
28 in mind:
29 (a) That countries have the full right to refuse migrant individuals; and;
30 (b) The receiving country's ability to provide migrants a safe living environment;
31 4. *Calls for* transparent communication between businesses and the Member States for the purposes of
32 helping temporary labor migrants by:
33 (a) Accurately reporting the number of workers needed for a specific position; and;
34 (b) Allowing governments provide temporary labor migrants with wage and legal protections;
35 5. *Recommends* providing educational programming for migrant children which would include:

- 36 (a) Translation services for migrant children;
- 37 (b) Incorporating programs to support the integration of migrant children in school systems;
- 38 (c) Promoting bilingualism to support international business and economics; and;
- 39 (d) Providing counseling services in order to;
- 40 (i) Address the hardships migrant children must overcome; and;
- 41 (ii) Lessen the likelihood of crime amongst migrant youth;

42 6. *Encourages* the creation of programs in both host countries and countries of origin that facilitate the
43 return and reintegration of migrants, including:

- 44 (a) Educational programs, which train migrants in skills and areas of knowledge in demand by their
45 countries of origin;
- 46 (b) Investment programs, which encourage return through incentivizing entrepreneurial efforts by
47 expatriates in their home countries; and;
- 48 (c) Inter-state partnership programs, which connect countries with high immigrant populations to
49 the nations from which they are arriving in order to formulate specific context-based return efforts;

50 7. *Invites* regional organizations, such as the Ibero-American States and the European Union, to develop
51 infrastructure for migrant growth:

- 52 (a) Including public transportation for workers, safe and sanitary factories, public health provisions,
53 poverty reduction projects, job training, educational facilities, and more;

54 8. *Encourages* Member States to promote and strengthen the International Organization for Migration and
55 their continual advocacy for policies protecting female migrant workers:

- 56 (a) Provisions for gender equality in economic empowerment for women migrants, since women
57 make-up 73.4 percent of international migrant domestic workers;
- 58 (b) Formulating educational programs for women in STEM-related job training; and;
- 59 (c) Funded in coordination with donating member countries at their own discretion.
