SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Promotion and protection of the rights of children

SUBMITTED TO: The General Assembly Third Committee

The General Assembly Third Committee,

Recalling the Universal Declaration on the Rights of the Child, the Convention on the Rights of the Child, and it's Optional Protocol,

Recalling all relevant resolutions from the Human Rights Council relating to the protection of the rights of 3 children including the most recent resolution 40/15, 4

Further recalling Security Council resolution 1612 (2005) of 26 July 2005 that calls for the adoption of the 5 Children's Rights Working Group, 6

Concerned with the lack of previous discussion by the General Assembly and its committees on the impact 7 of the rural-urban divide on all people, 8

Concerned with the effects of the rural-urban divide on the potential success of children,

Acknowledging the variance between States and the complex nature of its involvement in issues with children 10 in armed conflicts, migrant children and disparities of women and girls,

Inspired by the work done by all the countries in the General Assembly Third Committee,

- 1. Acknowledges concerns from Member States that disparities from rural and urban areas have affected the 13 equal enforcement and promotion of the rights of children; 14
- 2. Encourages the establishment of strategies by states in order to fully combat the pernicious effects of 15 unequal enforcement of the rights of children; 16
 - 3. Requests regional cooperation in combating the rural-urban divide, specifically in sharing best-practices between states that will build a stronger system of cooperation;
- 4. Calls Upon the Children's Rights Working Group to add the rural-urban divide to it's agenda of issues 19 to address during its next meeting; 20
 - 5. Invites the Children's Rights Working Group to address the issues of education, child marriage, child labour, and health and wellbeing in it's meeting, specifically towards drafting strategies for consideration during the next session of the General Assembly;
 - 6. Recommends continued support of the Children's Rights Working Group, to further enable the important work being done, and that will be done in the future;
 - 7. Requests the Secretary-General, with consideration to the various United Nation subsidiary bodies whom comprise the robust system of legal protections to children, as well as with consultation of Member States, to submit to the General Assembly, at it's seventy-fifth session, a report that evaluates disparities created by the rural-urban divide.
