The International Telecommunication Union,

1 Affirming the rights of disabled persons outlined by the Convention on the Rights of People with Disabilities 2 (CRPD),

Recognizing the critical role that accessing governmental resources play in the lives of citizens, especially those with disabilities and with specific needs,

Taking into consideration the growing prevalence of instances where government resources are not available outside of an online context,

Realizing the difficulties that disabled persons face when trying to utilize many information and communi-8 cation technologies (ICTs),

9 Taking into account the continuous evolution of both the definition of disabilities and the technologies 10 available.

Guided by the goals and provisions outlined in the Connect 2020 agenda, specifically Target 2.5.B,

Noting how certain private resources can have equal importance to governmental resources in the modern age,

- 1. Recommends Member States governmental resources, meaning any application or website detailing information provided by the government, implement accessibility options for persons with disabilities and persons with specific needs;
- 2. Further invites individual Member States to offer incentives such as subsidies to businesses that comply with these standards for their websites;
- 3. Establishes an ITU project to raise necessary funds for Member States through voluntary contributions through the preexisting ITU framework, which may be petitioned by Member States for funds in order to properly facilitate these subsidies;
- 4. Encourages partnerships with non-governmental organizations, such as but not limited to Disabled Peoples International and Daughters of Charity Technology and Research in Disability in order to fund and research new and innovative ways to better reach disabled people, specifically those previously overlooked;
- 5. Recommends the creation of The Inclusive Accessibility Technology Foundation designed with the purpose of:
- (a) Researching specific technologies that would allow those with physical, mental or other disabilities to access governmental resources provided on ICTs;
- 29 (b) Developing specific accessibility recommendations that would work with the various platforms 30 which ICTs encompass;
- 31 (c) Continuously updating and adapting information on the technologies available to address both 32 the evolution of technology and the changing definitions of disabilities.
