7. <i>Further establishes</i> that the magnitude of this expansion is to be based upon the amount of voluntary donations given annually to the expansion effort and for the program to operate until 20 January 2025, at which point it will be reviewed by the Security Council;	
	o accept and facilitate voluntary donation of Member States in support of local systems to victims of violent crimes;

- 9. *Creates* the International Counter Insurgency Training Force (ICOIN-TF) with the head of ICOIN-TF being appointed by the Secretary-General and members consisting of volunteers specially trained and selected forces from Member States approved by the Security Council;
- 37 10. *Further decides* that the mandate of the ICOIN-TF be as follows:
- 38 (a) Train local police forces and armies in both counter insurgency;
- 39 (b) Operations including border securing operations;
- 40 (c) Train local police forces in Community Oriented Policing approaches, as outlined by the United
 41 Nations Recommendations on Preventing Violent Extremism;
- 42 (d) ICOIN-TF will not infringe on current unilateral military training in the region;

43 11. Further decides that the Security Council shall decide annually the number of forces needed for the

12. *Further decides* that the budget for the ICOIN-TF will be provided by Member States contributing forces to organization and the budget will fluctuate based on the need determined by the Security Council;
