The World Conference on Youth.

Acknowledging Security Council resolution 2250 of 9 December 2015, which conveys the urgency to enable youth to participate in decision making at all governmental levels,

3 Bearing in mind the Secretary General's Report to the General Assembly, resolution 36/215 of 19 June 1981, 4 which defines the age of youth as 15 through 24,

Recalling the 2030 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), specifically those addressing advancement of youth engagement,

Emphasizing that youth are the future of the world,

Reaffirming the principle of state sovereignty,

Recognizing variances in cultural and religious practices,

10 Deeply concerned that young people are susceptible to the greatest consequences of marginalization i.e., 11 violence, gang activity and extremist ideologies,

- 12 1. Calls upon Member States to create their own national policies and initiatives calling for youth empow-
 - (a) after school programs for youth where needed;
- (b) training regarding healthy and educationally stimulating habits specifically in forms of relationships, i.e., mentor-ships and student clubs;
- (c) specific measures to include representation of youth in decision-making at a local, regional and national level:
- (d) youth vocational training programs to offer skills to equip the youth to be successful within their economy and abroad;
- 2. Encourages Member States and relevant actors to consider providing more educational scholarships to youth who are marginalized;
- 3. Calls upon Member States to open community centers in order to foster community and national identity as the biggest reason for youth joining violent groups is to feel a sense of belonging;
- 4. Supports a criminal justice system that emphasizes rehabilitation and the elevation of youth as to not forsake their potential futures;
- 5. Urges that Member States use the resources provided by the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) and any other relevant actors to greater increase youth participation;
- 6. *Notes* that Member States have the discretion to reject or limit the intervention of external organizations based on regional, traditional and religious customs.
