

- In addition to receiving an early country selection, participating schools will also receive a \$5.00 per delegate discount for the 2014 AMUN Conference.



- All costumes must adhere to Rule 2.2 Diplomatic Courtesy. No culturally themed or offensive costumes will be allowed at the dance.





The Mayfair room will be open to Faculty Advisors for use outside of scheduled AMUN events.












SHERATON CHICAGO HOTEL & TOWERS VENUE MAP
