## 2014 AMUN KEYNOTE ADDRESS

**PAUL RUSESABAGINA**

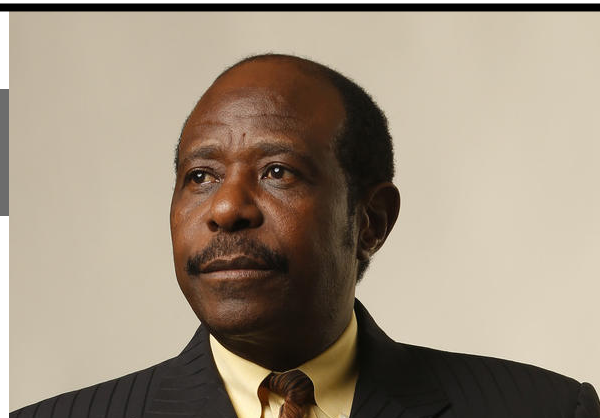
**11:00 A.M. TO 12:00 P.M. 23 NOVEMBER 2014**

Paul Rusesabagina is the real life hero of the acclaimed film *Hotel Rwanda* and the President and Founder of the Hotel Rwanda Rusesabagina Foundation. Rusesabagina saved the lives of more than 1,200 people during the 1994 Rwandan genocide. He served as manager of the Hotel des Mille Collines in Kigali and bravely risked his life to shelter Hutus and Tutsis who were seeking refuge from the genocide that killed more than 800,000 people.

Rusesabagina now tours the world speaking about social justice, human rights activism and the lessons learned from the Rwandan genocide, one of the worst tragedies of the 20th century. In 2000, Paul Rusesabagina received the Immortal Chaplains Prize for Humanity. In 2005 he received the highest civilian award in the United States, the Presidential Medal of Freedom, from President George W. Bush. After receiving these honors, Rusesabagina formed the Hotel Rwanda Rusesabagina Foundation to help provide voice to victims of genocide and support peace efforts in Rwanda and throughout the world. What started as a personal mission to teach the lessons of Rwanda has become an international movement to fight genocide throughout the world.

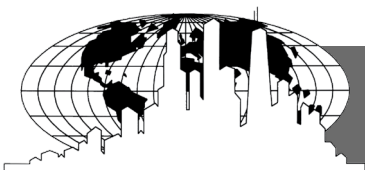
The Hotel Rwanda Rusesabagina Foundation raises public awareness about the need for an internationally administered Truth and Reconciliation Commission for Rwanda and the Great Lakes Region of Africa. The Foundation also works on issues related to the ongoing conflict in the Democratic Republic of Congo, where more than 5 million have died. The Foundation is campaigning for an end to Rwandan military intervention in the Congo and against the deadly exploitation of conflict minerals in the region.

Rusesabagina's popular autobiography, *An Ordinary Man*, was published by Penguin Group (USA) Inc. in April 2006. He will be available to sign copies of his autobiography after the keynote speech.



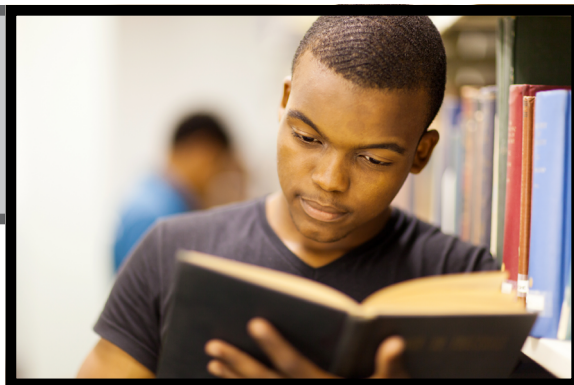

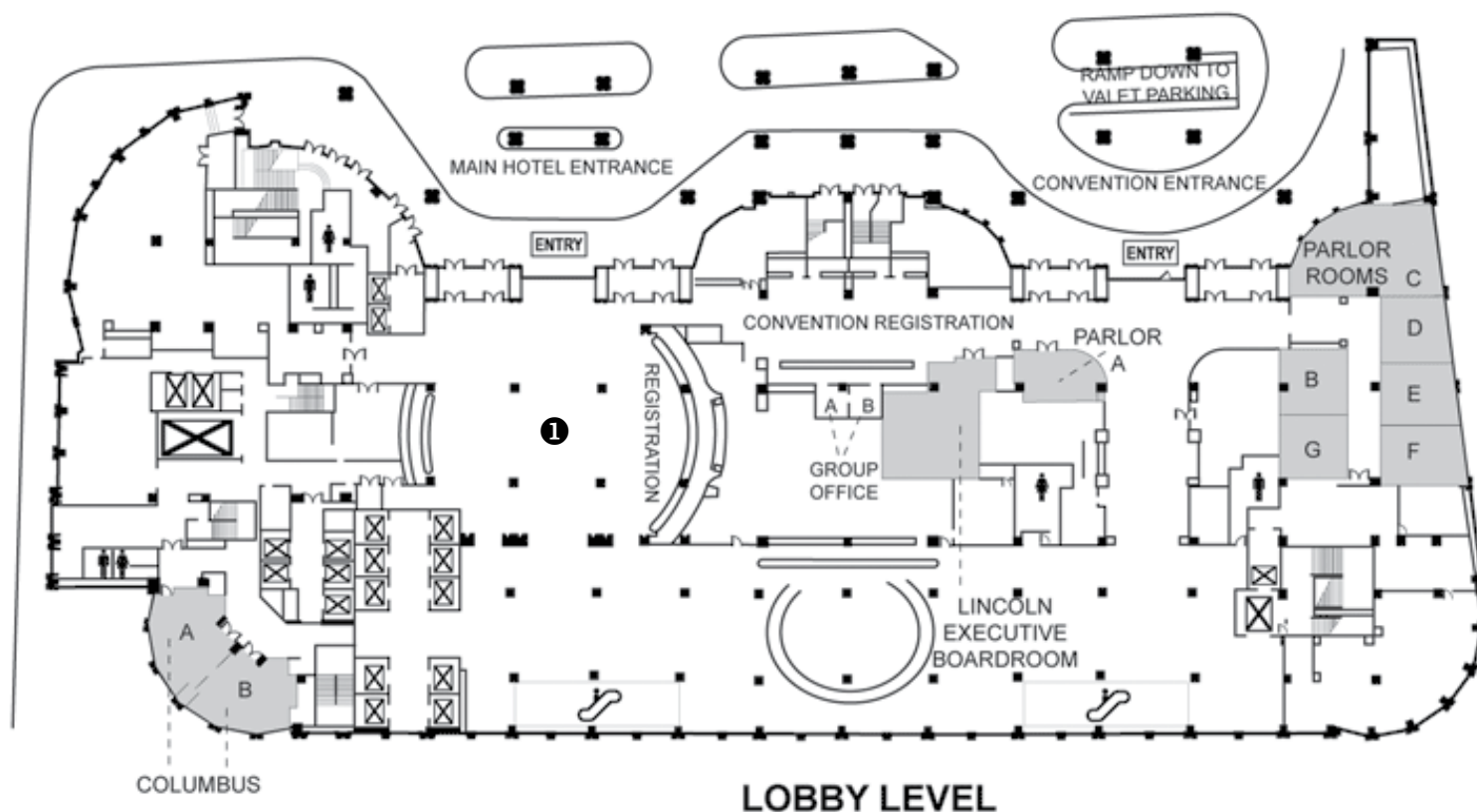

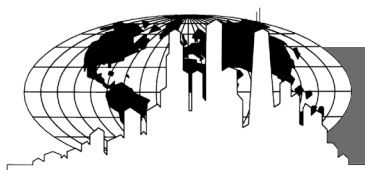

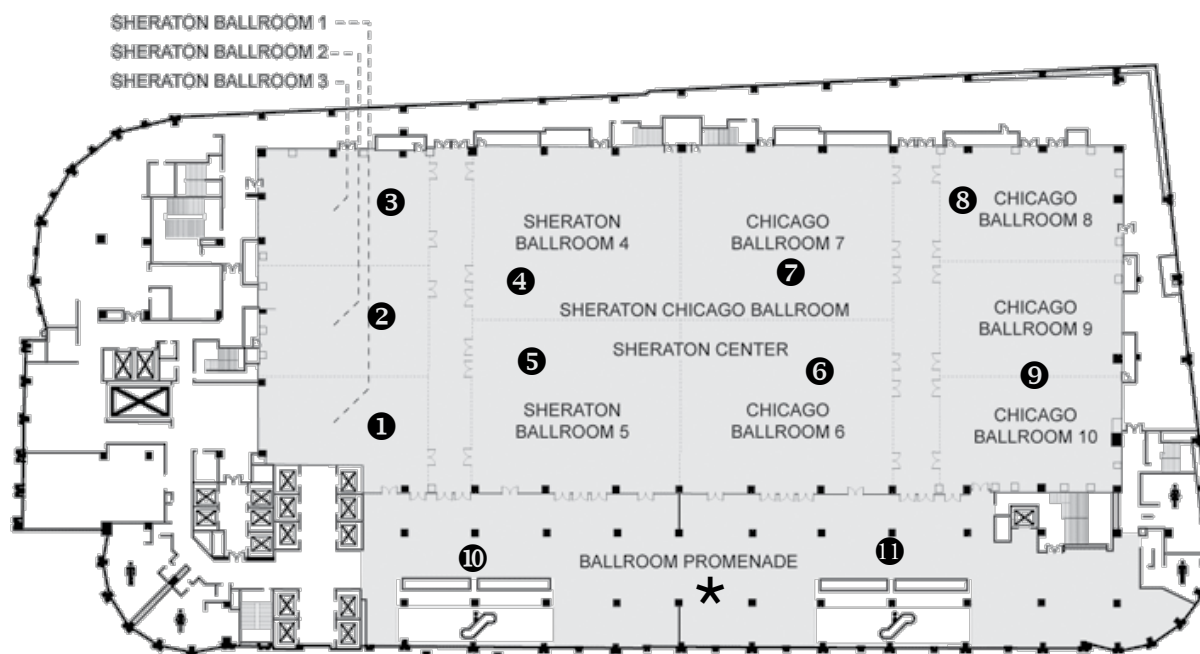




# SHERATON CHICAGO HOTEL & TOWERS VENUE MAP

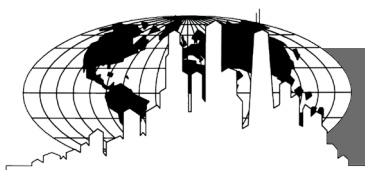
## SAFETY AT AMUN

AMUN places extreme importance on the safety of our participants and guests. We hope that you have an excellent and fun learning experience while at the Conference, but encourage everyone to consider safety issues in and around the Conference hotel. We also suggest that you follow several common sense rules to keep all participants safe during the Conference. These include the following:

- As a general rule, do not leave the hotel grounds without letting your group know how to find you;

- Always travel with at least one person that you know;

- Inform one of the leaders of your group immediately if you have a safety concern, or if any emergency situation occurs to you or another participant, regardless of the time;
- Remember that safety should always be more important than avoiding minor embarrassment to you or another person.

If an emergency occurs that requires immediate help, you should contact hotel security (dial 0 and ask the operator for "security") for assistance.

AMUN's goal is to provide an *educational, fun and safe experience* for everyone – and we appreciate your help in reaching that goal!

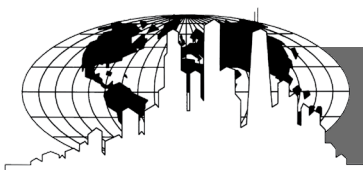

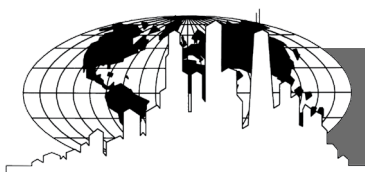
