- A non-refundable \$75 deposit is required for each country at the time of application and will be applied toward the school's 2015 fees.
- In addition to receiving an early country selection, participating schools will also receive a \$5.00 per delegate discount for the 2015 AMUN Conference.




Paul Rusesabagina is the real life hero of the acclaimed film Hotel Rwanda and the President and Founder of the Hotel Rwanda Rusesabagina Foundation. Rusesabagina saved the lives of more than 1,200 people during the 1994 Rwandan genocide. He served as manager of the Hotel des Mille Collines in Kigali and bravely risked his life to shelter Hutus and Tutsis who were seeking refuge from the genocide that killed more than 800,000 people.

Rusesabagina now tours the world speaking about social justice, human rights




The Hotel Rwanda Rusesabagina Foundation raises public awareness about the need for an internationally administered Truth and Reconciliation Commission for Rwanda and the Great Lakes Region of Africa. The Foundation also works on issues related to the ongoing conflict in the Democratic Republic of Congo, where more than 5 million have died. The Foundation is campaigning for an end to Rwandan military intervention in the Congo and against the deadly exploitation of conflict minerals in the region.

Rusesabagina's popular autobiography, An Ordinary Man, was published by Penguin Group (USA) Inc. in April 2006. He will be available to sign copies of his autobiography after the keynote speech.





SHERATON CHICAGO HOTEL & TOWERS VENUE MAP








SHERATON CHICAGO HOTEL & TOWERS VENUE MAP




