
- All schools that enter the lottery will be randomly selected for their choice of country assignment.

- A non-refundable \$75 deposit is required for each country at the time of application and will be applied toward the school's 2016 fees.
- In addition to receiving an early country selection, participating schools will also receive a \$5.00 per delegate discount for the 2016 AMUN Conference.






SHERATON CHICAGO HOTEL & TOWERS VENUE MAP










SHERATON CHICAGO HOTEL & TOWERS VENUE MAP







SAFETY AT AMUN




