

- All schools that enter the lottery will be randomly selected for their choice of country assignment.
- After each participating school has been assigned one delegation in the first round, those schools that registered for more than one delegation will receive an additional assignment in a subsequent round, until all registration requests have been fulfilled.
- Lottery applications are due on Sunday, 20 November before 9:00 p.m. in the Ohio Room.
- A non-refundable \$75 deposit is required for each country at the time of application and will be applied toward the school's 2017 fees.
- In addition to receiving an early country selection, participating schools will also receive a \$5.00 per delegate discount for the 2017 AMUN Conference.



SHERATON GRAND HOTEL VENUE MAP








SHERATON GRAND HOTEL VENUE MAP
