SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Protection of global climate for present and future gener-

ations of humankind

SUBMITTED TO: The General Assembly Second Committee

The General Assembly Second Committee,

Expressing Appreciation for the Paris Agreement and emphasizing the value of global cooperation in achieving climate goals and that protection of the global climate is an internationally held responsibility,

Noting with deep concern the increasingly extreme weather events caused by climate change that threaten agricultural productivity, quality of life and limits access to food,

Reaffirms commitment to the goal of limiting annual global temperature rises to below two degrees Celsius through cooperation between Member States,

Expresses concern regarding the barriers existing for Least Developed Countries in achieving climate goals, such as costs, debt burden and the severity of climate damage and impact,

Expresses concern regarding the barriers existing for Least Developed Countries in achieving climate goals, such as costs, debt burden and the severity of climate damage and impact,

Recalls the United Nations Development Programme's emphasis that all Member States require access to necessary resources in order to uphold Sustainable Development Goals,

Reiterating its support for the objectives of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change and its technology-sharing approach as a foundational means to deliver unprecedented social and economic traditions,

Believing in the necessity of regulating global temperature through means of increasing green energy availability and lowering carbon emissions,

- 1. *Urges* Member States to promote the necessity for protection of the global climate through establishing domestic financial plans within specific climate-focused government bodies and committees and to set clear, specific goals for improving the global climate;
- 2. Encourages transparency within and between nations regarding climate impact and funding of climate plans to reduce the negative climate impact by participation in the Voluntary National Review and for Member States to submit reports to the High-Level Political Forum on Sustainable Development;
- 3. Suggests that Member States utilize the Green Climate Fund to increase the production of renewable energy by investing in the most accessible green energy sources, including wind, solar and geothermal energy;
- 4. Welcomes Member States to join global partnerships targeting climate change in order to work towards achieving the goal to lower the annual, rising global temperature to below two degrees Celsius, specifically as follows:
- (a) The United Nations Environment Programme's Coalition: The Climate and Clean Air Coalition;
- (b) The Green Climate Fund, established by United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change;

- 5. *Invites* the sharing of intellectual and physical resources that combat climate change between Member States through the Scaling Up Renewable Energy Program and the Climate Technology Accelerator to reduce the financial burden of implementing climate plans; ;
- 6. Suggests Member States cooperate with the Food and Agriculture Organization, International Fund for Agricultural Development, United Nations Development Programme, the United Nations Development Programme and the World Food Programme to develop climate-smart agriculture and increase financial assistance to small farmers to enable them to adapt to climate change;
- 7. Encourages the World Bank and the United Nations Development Programme to cooperate in their capacity-building programs in order to efficiently implement climate-focused plans;
- 8. Recommends Member States to provide more support to the Joint Sustainable Development Goal Fund and support the development of green energy, adaptation to climate change, including infrastructure and early warning systems through blended finance;
- 9. Calls upon Member States to support the Global Initiative for Information Integrity on Climate Change to prevent misinformation about climate change to ensure the creation of educated financial plans that understand the multi-faceted issue of climate change.
