SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Situation in Bosnia-Herzegovina

SUBMITTED TO: The Historical Security Council – 1994

The Historical Security Council - 1994,

Reaffirming Security Council Resolution 743 of 21 February 1992, establishing the United Nations Protection Force (UNPROFOR) to dissuade intercommunal violence,

Determining that the situation in the former Yugoslavia region continues to constitute a threat to international peace and security,

Concerned with continued military action in the Security Council-designated safe zones,

Acknowledging, as the UNPROFOR Commander has stated, the overrun nature of the established safe zones,

Deeply concerned with the disruption to humanitarian aid caused by conflict in the region,

Further concerned with the interdiction of UNPROFOR personnel in both humanitarian relief missions and observation missions,

Recognizing that sending more humanitarian aid without further mediation only superficially addresses the problem at hand and not the root of the issue,

- 13 1. Condemns any action by any active faction involved in the Bosnian dispute that prevents or 14 inhibits the delivery of humanitarian aid to allocated areas;
 - 2. Emphasizes the necessity for humanitarian aid and the guarantee of its delivery to areas in need, specifically in the capital of Sarajevo;
- 3. Calls upon member states to provide humanitarian assistance to the greatest of their financial and logistical ability;
 - 4. Strongly recommends a minimum presence of 18,000 peacekeeping troops in the Sarajevo region to meet the "safe operating minimum" recommended by the UNPROFOR Command;
 - 5. Extends UNPROFOR mandate to 31 December 1994;
 - 6. Approves the request from the UNPROFOR Commander for:
 - (a) An increased number of cargo and transport planes for the explicit purpose of humanitarian assistance, defined as "The distribution of water, food, medical supplies and the facilitation of medical evacuations in light of increasing civilian injuries and casualties;;
 - (b) An increase in the provision of lightly armed armored vehicles to ensure the protection of designated safe zones;
 - (c) An increase in small arms, specifically for use by UNPROFOR peacekeepers, to ensure the protection of safe zones and the delivery of humanitarian aid;
- 7. Reaffirms, as is outlined in the United Nations Peacekeeping Operations Principles and Guidelines, the situations in which UNPROFOR may need to use force to execute its mandates as:
 - (a) The disruption in the process of humanitarian aid provision;
 - (b) The imminent threat of physical attack on civilians within designated safe zones;
- (c) The enforcement of the current neutral zones established by Resolutions 819 and 824;
