SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: The Situation in Rwanda

SUBMITTED TO: The Historical Security Council – 1994

The Historical Security Council – 1994,

1 *Understanding* the urgency of addressing the crisis in the Republic of Rwanda and creating a
2 swift end to violence,

3 *Fully alarmed* by the severity of the situation and outbreak of political violence and determined
4 to protect human life,

5 *Recognizing* the need for a swift de-escalation and end to all acts of violence and aggression,

6 *Affirming* a commitment to the principles of the United Nations Charter and placing the highest
7 priority on protection of human life and establishment of a durable peace,

8 1. *Recommends* all non-essential potential political targets to seek refuge, safety and possibly
9 evacuation to amicable regions;

10 2. *Urges* all able Member States to send humanitarian aid, medical supplies and means of
11 evacuation to civilians in need:

12 (a) With specific focus on the civilians seeking safety in the Amahoro National Stadium;

13 (b) With Republic of France providing medical evacuation equipment and transporta-
14 tion to patients out of the Republic of Rwanda to the Czech Republic;

15 (c) With hospitals in the Czech Republic being available and willing to receive medevac
16 patients from the Republic of Rwanda;

17 3. *Establishes* a direct channel of communication between the Crisis Committee in Rwanda
18 and the United Nations Security Council to promote diplomacy and peaceful negotiations:

19 (a) Requesting hourly reports by The United Nations Assistance Mission for Rwanda (UN-
20 AMIR) to the Security Council to ensure swift action;

21 4. *Recommending* able Member States to provide aid to neighboring Member States who are
22 currently taking in refugees of the conflict in the Republic of Rwanda:

23 (a) The United States of America will allocate 10 million dollars from their current United
24 States Agency for International Development (USAID) budget to help mitigate the financial burden of
25 running refugee camps;

26 5. *Urges* the United Nations Administrative and Budgetary Committee, in conjunction with the
27 United Nations High Commissioner for Refugee, to swiftly meet to begin discussing a budget for aiding
28 neighboring Member States that will be accepting Rwandan refugees:

29 (a) Said budget will seek to alleviate the cost of food, medical aid, sanitation supplies
30 and anything else these hosting governments request assistance in funding;

31 6. *Decides* to remain actively seized on the matter.
