SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: The Situation in the Sudans

SUBMITTED TO: The Security Council A

The Security Council A,

1 *Recalling* the creation of the United Nations Mission in Sudan (UNMIS) in resolution SC-A/2,

2 *Deeply disturbed by* the escalation of violence in Babanusa and surrounding areas on 30 Novem-
3 ber 2025 and the days leading up to the conflict in the face of resolutions SC-A/1 and SC-A/2 which the
4 RSF agreed to honor deescalation and the beginning of peace talks, as well as the escalation of the
5 conflicts beginning in El-Fashir on 29 October 2025,

6 *Noting* the responsibilities and obligations outlined in the 1951 Refugee Convention, as well as
7 past violations of the rights of refugees in the Sudanese region,

8 *Reaffirming* the complete political and territorial sovereignty of Sudan,,

9 *Recognizing* that promises of humanitarian aid have no merit when there is a significant funding
10 gap,

11 1. *Directs* the reallocation of personnel and resources from the United Nations Mission in South
12 Sudan (UNMISS) and the United Nations Interim Security Force for Abyei (UNISFA) to the United Nations
13 Mission in Sudan (UNMIS), established in resolution SC-A/2, with additional resources funded through:

14 (a) Contributions from Member States, which shall aim to mitigate the 36 percent fund-
15 ing gap in United Nations humanitarian aid programs;

16 (b) United Nations budgets approved for designation to Sudan by the General Assembly;

17 2. *Requests* the General Assembly to consider the inclusion of necessary funding for UNMIS
18 initiatives in the upcoming budget;

19 3. *Instructs* UNMIS to:

20 (a) Construct shelters to receive the refugees fleeing violence to neighboring countries
21 that are willing to receive them, with shelters and aid funded by the United Nations pending approval
22 by the General Assembly as opposed to the receiving countries;

23 (b) Monitor corridors to ensure ensure they remain demilitarized, unobstructed and pro-
24 tected;

25 (c) Facilitate the deployment of medical aid, food and water, protection from weather
26 and generators;

27 4. *Calls upon* Member States to utilize bilateral and multilateral data sharing agreements in
28 order to:

29 (a) Provide the Panel of Experts, which shall be hereafter referred to as "the Committee,"
30 with information necessary to advise on plans for refugee support pursuant to resolution 2725 (2024)
31 of 8 March 2024;

32 (b) Increase information available to the international community regarding refugees
33 fleeing Sudan;

34 (c) Inform the operations of the UNMISS pursuant to resolution SC-A/2;

35 (d) Facilitate collaboration between the African Union and United Nations bodies;

36 5. *Directs* the Committee to:

37 (a) Organize, facilitate and oversee safe, orderly movement of refugees from crisis-
38 affected areas to designated safe and accepting states;

39 (b) Communicate with bordering nations of Sudan and other regional actors through
40 existing frameworks in the African Union, including Chad, South Sudan, Sierra Leone, Egypt, Libya, Ethiopia
41 and the Central African Republic, to formulate plans to handle the influx of refugees;

42 (c) Establish a plan for the secure relocation of existing peacekeeping personnel and
43 resources in UNMISS and UNISFA to UNMIS; and;

44 6. *Authorizes* the creation of United Nations-supervised humanitarian evacuation corridors, in-
45 cluding air, land and maritime routes, where needed and feasible.
