Alarmed by how the country of Sudan has been embroiled in conflict since April of 2023,

Reaffirming Sudan's sovereign equality,

Deeply concerned about the direction the conflict has taken in regards to the humanitarian crisis of Sudanese civilians' lack of access to food, water, and medicine,

Recognizing how decreased sanitation due to the lack of water has negatively affected the overall health of Sudanese civilians,

- 1. Advises for allocation of material resources from the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA) to the African Union for the purposes of administering and providing equitable and safe access to humanitarian aid;
 - 2. To serve with the main purpose of coordinating humanitarian bodies:
 - (a) Basing the Sudan Aid Network in the United Nations Office in Nairobi, Kenya;
 - 3. Investigating collaboration with willing, credible international organizations;
- 4. Establishing the Sudan Aid Network acting under the primary goal of delivering humanitarian aid:
- (a) Humanitarian aid consisting of food, water, sanitation supplies, medicine, and other forms of aid;
 - (b) Delivering aid through approved air, land, and sea ports of entry through third-party international organizations and programs;
 - (c) Recommends that all aid be monitored by the United Nation Office for Project Services;
 - 5. Calling for the delivering of humanitarian aid consisting of clean water, medicine, food, and other forms of humanitarian aid through direct supplies to communities in Sudan through the methods of the following:
 - (a) Having previously selected the United Nations sub-organizations and humanitarian organizations to deliver aid to the areas most affected directly;
- (b) Sending trucks and similar vehicles straight into communities, directly distributing aid;
 - (c) Directly giving resources to the civilians in the communities;
- (d) Aid will be sent through the following: the Port of Sudan and the previously closed Chad-Sudanese Border, including the Adre border crossing;
 - 6. Prioritizing where aid is delivered with the advice of:
 - (a) Observers of the African Union and the regional experts;
 - (b) Observers of the United Nations;

(c) Sudanese community and governmental leaders;
