Recalling its relevant resolutions 1556 (2004) of 11 June 2004, 1591 (2005) of 29 March 2009, 2573 (2021) of 27 April 2021, 2736 (2024) of 14 June 2024 and SC-B/1 of November 23, 2025,

Noting with appreciation the 2025 report of the panel of experts on the situation in Sudan (S/2025/239) and the recommendations contained therein,

Acknowledging the agreed upon three month ceasefire facilitated by the African Union and applauding the regional cooperation to reach that agreement,

Reaffirming Sudan's inherent right to sovereignty, equality, independence, unity, peace, and territorial integrity, and recalling the important principles of non-interference and regional cooperation,

Recalling the need for consent of host nations prior to deployment of United Nations peace-keeping forces in compliance with chapters VI and VII of the United Nations Charter,

Emphasizing the importance of further Sudanese-led peace building efforts towards reaching a just, comprehensive, sustainable, and permanent peace to bring stability to the region and further empower Sudanese leaders to secure local conflict resolution agreements,

Noting the need for sustained, unimpeded, and reliable cross-border and cross-line humanitarian assistance into Darfur and other areas affected by the present conflict in Sudan,

Urging involved parties to assist in ensuring the necessary aid reaches those in need,

Recognizing the challenges of the ceasefire in regards to the fragile infrastructure of the region, such as transportation methods and unexploded ordinance, to successfully deliver humanitarian aid,

Recognizing also the fragile infrastructure in the region that could impede aid but not at the will of the parties in conflict,

Gravely concerned by the severe lack of funding to humanitarian aid programs in Sudan,

Expressing concern over the mass displacement and humanitarian crisis in Sudan created by the ongoing conflict and the effects it has had the nations receiving Sudanese refugees,

Strongly condemning all violations of international humanitarian and human rights law in the Darfur region, with particular concern for the proliferation of violence against civilians and gender based violence against women and girls in Sudan,

Recalling that violators of international humanitarian law or other human rights frameworks may be subject to targeted sanctions in accordance with paragraphs 3.c of Resolution 1591 (2005),

- 1. Stresses the importance of regional cooperation and dialogue in promoting the safe and unimpeded delivery of humanitarian aid guaranteeing the most effective outcome for the betterment of civilians;
- 2. Supports the African Union advisory opinions on the deliverance of necessary humanitarian assistance to the afflicted regions and peoples;
- 3. Decides to reengage United Nations humanitarian organization operations in the previously closed main border crossing in Adre, Chad;

- 4. *Urges* all parties to the conflict to take all steps toward preventing future violations of international human rights and humanitarian law;
- 5. Calls on the parties to the conflict in Darfur to adhere to their obligations under international humanitarian law, specifically their obligation to protect civilians during times of armed conflict;
- 6. Demands that all parties to the conflict commit themselves to ensuring the protection of displaced civilians in Sudan;
- 7. Calls on Member States to increase committed funding amounts to the severely underfunded humanitarian organizations and missions in Sudan;
 - 8. Requests the panel of experts on Sudan provide a report on the implementation of the cease-fire and current resolution before the conclusion of the current ceasefire agreement;
 - 9. Decides to remain actively seized of the matter.
