32 33 Recalling its relevant resolutions, including resolutions 2308 (2025) of 17 November, 2025 and 242 (1967) of 22 November and recognizing that the situation in the Gaza Strip and the West Bank constitutes a threat to both international and regional peace and security,

Expressing its appreciation for the Twenty-Point Peace Plan for Gaza as endorsed by resolution 2308 (2025) of 17 November, 2025 for attempting to cease hostilities and establish negotiations between the parties concerned,

Emphasizing a two-state solution as the only path to a comprehensive, lasting peace and reaffirming the Palestinian people's inalienable right to Self-Determination as well as the sovereign equality of the State of Israel,

Desiring that civilians who have been impacted by the conflict come together in order to facilitate dialogue on the prospect of a peaceful coexistence,

Bearing in mind that a successful and sustained dialogue on the objective of two independent states living side-by-side in peace and security may take some time,

Believing that without dialogue, no ceasefire or mediation would be able to be upheld for a substantial amount of time,

- 1. Calls for the creation of a Center for Dialogue and Mediation (CDM), which focuses on bringing Israelis and Palestinians together to conduct dialogue sessions:
- (a) CDM's main goal is to familiarize every individual on each side of the conflict for international coexistence;
 - (b) This center for dialogue will be located in Amman, Jordan;
 - (i) It is of utmost importance to have the dialogue centered outside of the conflict lands so both peoples are on equal grounds;
 - (ii) Willing volunteers would be provided with free transportation and accommodation;
 - (iii) Dialogue will be conducted by independent moderators across the world;
 - A. Dialogue sessions will consist on willing volunteers from both Israel, Gaza, and the West Bank;
 - B. Moderators will be unbiased professionals recognized internationally with no ties to either party, who will work towards the benefit of both parties;
 - (c) Willing civilians on both sides of the conflict will attend a week long intense dialogue
- 30 facilitation;
- (i) This process shall continue every two weeks with new or returning individuals;
- (ii) Recognizing that dialogue is continuous, thus the CDM shall facilitate for many years to come;

- 2. *Encourages* all member states to assist in donating to the CDM for its efforts in facilitating a dialogue and mediation;
- 36 3. Expresses its hope for the dialogue sessions' ability to encourage both the Palestinian and Israeli peoples to familiarize, leading to productive conversations for mediation and for everlasting international peace;
 - 4. Decides to remain actively seized of the matter.
