SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Situation in the Middle East Including the Palestinian Question

SUBMITTED TO: The Security Council B

The Security Council B,

1 *Recalling* its relevant resolutions, including resolutions 2308 (2025) of 17 November, 2025 and
2 242 (1967) of 22 November and recognizing that the situation in the Gaza Strip and the West Bank
3 constitutes a threat to both international and regional peace and security,

4 *Expressing* its appreciation for the Twenty-Point Peace Plan for Gaza as endorsed by resolu-
5 tion 2308 (2025) of 17 November, 2025 for attempting to cease hostilities and establish negotiations
6 between the parties concerned,

7 *Emphasizing* a two-state solution as the only path to a comprehensive, lasting peace and *reaf-*
8 *firming* the Palestinian people's inalienable right to Self-Determination as well as the sovereign equality
9 of the State of Israel,

10 *Desiring* that civilians who have been impacted by the conflict come together in order to facil-
11 itate dialogue on the prospect of a peaceful coexistence,

12 *Bearing in mind* that a successful and sustained dialogue on the objective of two independent
13 states living side-by-side in peace and security may take some time,

14 *Believing* that without dialogue, no ceasefire or mediation would be able to be upheld for a
15 substantial amount of time,

16 1. *Calls* for the creation of a Center for Dialogue and Mediation (CDM), which focuses on bringing
17 Israelis and Palestinians together to conduct dialogue sessions:

18 (a) CDM's main goal is to familiarize every individual on each side of the conflict for
19 international coexistence;

20 (b) This center for dialogue will be located in Amman, Jordan;

21 (i) It is of utmost importance to have the dialogue centered outside of the conflict lands
22 so both peoples are on equal grounds;

23 (ii) Willing volunteers would be provided with free transportation and accommodation;

24 (iii) Dialogue will be conducted by independent moderators across the world;

25 A. Dialogue sessions will consist on willing volunteers from both Israel, Gaza, and the
26 West Bank;

27 B. Moderators will be unbiased professionals recognized internationally with no ties to
28 either party, who will work towards the benefit of both parties;

29 (c) Willing civilians on both sides of the conflict will attend a week long intense dialogue
30 facilitation;

31 (i) This process shall continue every two weeks with new or returning individuals;

32 (ii) Recognizing that dialogue is continuous, thus the CDM shall facilitate for many years
33 to come;

34 2. *Encourages* all member states to assist in donating to the CDM for its efforts in facilitating a
35 dialogue and mediation;

36 3. *Expresses its hope* for the dialogue sessions' ability to encourage both the Palestinian and
37 Israeli peoples to familiarize, leading to productive conversations for mediation and for everlasting
38 international peace;

39 4. *Decides* to remain actively seized of the matter.
