SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: The Question of Palestine

SUBMITTED TO: The Historical Security Council – 1967

The Historical Security Council - 1967,

- 1 Condemning the breaches of the 1949 General Armistice Agreement,
- 2 Understanding that there is a need to end the ongoing violence,
- Recalling Security Council Resolution 228 (1966) of 25 November 1966, which states that military action, even in reprisal, will not be tolerated by the United Nations Security Council,
- Noting Security Council Resolutions 162 (1961) of 11 April 1961 and Security Council Resolution 171 (1962) of 9 April 1962 which asked for the cessation of violent incidents across the demarcation line,
 - 1. Deplores the use of force or aggression by all parties;
- 8 2. Declares accordingly that the violation of the territorial integrity of all parties will be met with a severe 9 condemnation by the Security Council and the possibility of severe consequences in accordance with the severity of 10 the violation;
- 3. Calls for a round of new negotiations between the State of Israel and its Arab neighbors in order to draft a comprehensive plan of action to deescalate the rising tensions in the region;
- 4. Requests the appointment of a special representative by the Secretary General of the United Nations in order to provide an immediate start to a new series of negotiations about the demilitarization of key zones between the State of Israel and its Arab neighbors;
- 5. Further Requests that the Secretary General keeps the situation under review and report to the Security Council as the situations develops;
 - 6. Decides to remain seized of the matter.
