SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: The Question of Palestine

SUBMITTED TO: The Historical Security Council – 1967

The Historical Security Council – 1967,

- 1 *Condemning* the breaches of the 1949 General Armistice Agreement,
2 *Understanding* that there is a need to end the ongoing violence,
3 *Recalling* Security Council Resolution 228 (1966) of 25 November 1966, which states that military action,
4 even in reprisal, will not be tolerated by the United Nations Security Council,
5 *Noting* Security Council Resolutions 162 (1961) of 11 April 1961 and Security Council Resolution 171 (1962)
6 of 9 April 1962 which asked for the cessation of violent incidents across the demarcation line,
7 1. *Deplores* the use of force or aggression by all parties;
8 2. *Declares accordingly* that the violation of the territorial integrity of all parties will be met with a severe
9 condemnation by the Security Council and the possibility of severe consequences in accordance with the severity of
10 the violation;
11 3. *Calls for* a round of new negotiations between the State of Israel and its Arab neighbors in order to draft
12 a comprehensive plan of action to deescalate the rising tensions in the region;
13 4. *Requests* the appointment of a special representative by the Secretary General of the United Nations in
14 order to provide an immediate start to a new series of negotiations about the demilitarization of key zones between
15 the State of Israel and its Arab neighbors;
16 5. *Further Requests* that the Secretary General keeps the situation under review and report to the Security
17 Council as the situations develops;
18 6. *Decides* to remain seized of the matter.
