SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Maintenance of International Peace and Security (COVID-19)

Noting with deep regret the severity of the COVID-19 pandemic and the strain it has put on populations and economies throughout the world,

- Emphasizing with vigor the sovereignty of all states,
- 4 Affirming the tenets of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights,
- 5 Recognizing the efforts of the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs,
- 6 Taking into account that one singular state cannot be blamed for the international spread of COVID-19,
- *Recognizing* the need to combat, in accordance with the United Nations Charter, threats to international peace and security caused by COVID-19,
- *Emphazising* the importance of Resolutions 74/270 (2020) and 74/274 (2020) in guaranteeing international cooperation and transparency,
 - Recalling the critical importance of Paragraph 12 of Resolution 2352 (2020) which demands a general and immediate cessation of hostilities in all situations on its agenda supports the efforts undertaken by the Secretary-General and his Special Representatives and Envoys in that respect,
 - Recognizing the increasing need for Personal Protective Equipment throughout the duration of the COVID-19 pandemic,
 - 1. Reminds the international community that COVID-19 is still a major threat to global health;
- 2. Calls upon the establishment of a commission of scientists and experts from multi-national health organizations to reconvene on 31 January 2021;
- 3. Requests that willing Member States join the COVAX Facility and take part in the most effective information-sharing and vaccine distribution endeavor to date and provide:
- 21 (a) Easy access to COVID-19 diagnostics, treatments and vaccines in both self-financing and funded 22 states;
- 23 (b) A much-needed insurance policy which allows self-financing countries to immediately vaccinate 24 10-10% of their populations;
 - (c) A pooling of resources across borders to expedite vaccine development and distribution;
- 4. Further Requests that all Member States take the necessary steps to prevent the loss of innocent life by following World Health Organization guidelines;
- 5. *Encourages* the increased production, distribution, and innovation of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) in each Member State:
- 30 (a) Suggests N95 masks, KN95 masks, respirators, nitrile gloves, Tyvek suits and face shields be 31 prioritized as PPE for increased production.
