SUBJECT OF RESOLUTION: Promoting The Health of Migrants

SUBMITTED TO: The World Health Organization Executive Board

The World Health Organization Executive Board,

- Recognizing the importance of promoting mental health, especially for migrants,
 - Acknowledging that migrants are often forced out of their homes as a result of religious conflict,
- 3 Understanding that religious conflict often spurs extremism in the form of terrorism on regions or cohorts of 4 individuals,
- Realizing that terrorism-induced removal from one's home is a traumatic experience that leads to adverse outcomes on mental health,
 - Addressing that these adverse experiences can create potential for the development of poor and/or fragile mental health conditions for migrants,
- 9 1. Encourages the present efforts made both unilaterally and multilaterally to approach regional situations with caution in order to limit inflammatory actions in the face of trauma;
 - 2. Instructs Healthcare Opportunities for Migrants Everywhere (HOME) as established in American Model United Nations, WHO (2020) Res. I/2 24 October, to disburse information to migrants regarding mental healthcare including, but not limited to:
 - (a) Dealing with trauma;
 - (b) Places to access therapy and mental healthcare;
 - (c) Places of worship for various religions;
 - (d) Places to access religious counseling;
- 3. Calls for migrant-receiving Member States, especially those with migrants experiencing religiously motivated terrorism, to not overlook the value of religious consolation with special consideration for the migrants' personal religious ties;
 - 4. Strongly recommends that Member States ensure that migrants have access to religious services and religious counseling;
- 5. *Implores* Member States to address issues concerning migrant mental health due to the variety of mental illnesses that stem from traumatic experiences.
